#### 1. **Purpose of Report (Including link to objectives)**

The purpose of the Chief Executive's Report is to highlight key developments within the Trust which have taken place since the last Board meeting.

### 2. Summary of Key Issues for Discussion

#### 2.1 Health and Social Care Integration Pioneers

"The government is encouraging all areas to develop their own reforms to public services.....an ambitious vision of making person-centred coordinated care and support the norm across the health and social care system in England over the coming years".

In the absence of a single blueprint for this, Norman Lamb MP, Minister of State for Care and Support, has written to invite expressions of interest from local area integration "pioneers" to develop their own local models at scale and pace - sharing the lessons learnt to help shape future design and policy making. The BANES health and social care community are keen to be amongst the first wave of five pioneers - who will submit their interest at the end of June. Together with local authority, other NHS, charity and third sector colleagues, we have scoped a model focused on integrated care solutions for older people. It is expected to reduce the burden of navigating a web of complex systems for individuals. It will also reduce hospital admissions and length of stay through enhanced multi-agency systems for person-centred planning and improved information flow between agencies. A central expert advice team will be available to support the successful pioneers.

# 2.2 West of England Academic Health Science Network (AHSN)

The West of England AHSN has been licensed with conditions. The West of England AHSN is now working through the feedback to bring partners together into a more cohesive network with opportunities to pool resources and collaborate on specific projects. A number of collaborative and development activities will take place over the coming months to further engage its partners.

### 2.3 NHS Foundation Trust Update

As at 17<sup>th</sup> June 2013, 6,236 public members have signed up to support the Trust's NHS Foundation Trust application. This figure is a slight decrease from figures reported last month which is due to the quarterly data cleanse.
