Hitting the roof

The Royal United Hospital's new Pathology Laboratory and Mortuary has reached a significant stage in its construction, with the completion of the roof structure.

Howard Jones, Director of Estates and Facilities at the RUH, tightened the last bolt on a beam which bears the signatures of representatives from the hospital user groups, the Trust and the project construction team.

A number of staff who have been involved in the project to date, along with the design and construction teams were invited to a small 'topping out' ceremony, to celebrate this important milestone.

After this, the internal works will start to gather pace and once the external brickwork is complete and windows are in place the site will look a lot different.


