Voting starts in new RUH Trust Public Governor elections

Voting has begun to elect four new Public Governors to the Royal United Hospitals Bath NHS Foundation Trust to help shape its services and plan for the future.

Voting packs have been sent out to all eligible public members – with the message to make your vote count before the ballot closes on 24 October.

The vacancies, created by the current Governors coming to the end of their term of office, are in the City of Bath, North East Somerset, Mendip, and North Wiltshire.

"These are exciting and changing times for the RUH and some really great candidates have put themselves forward for election. Becoming a Governor is a great opportunity to contribute to the development of the RUH and its role in our local communities that it serves."
