Meeting about Somerset health and care plans – you're invited

Members of the public are being invited to hear details of Somerset's future health and care plans at a meeting in Shepton Mallet on 15 October.

There will also be the opportunity to question the main speakers, Rosie Benneyworth, Director of Strategic Clinical Services Transformation for Somerset's Sustainability and Transformation Plan (STP) and James Scott, Chief Executive of the Royal United Hospitals Bath NHS Foundation Trust,

Dr Benneyworth will talk about 'Fit for my Future', new proposals for Somerset's health and care strategies. James Scott will give an update on the Trust's activities and plans over the coming year, which include the opening of the new state of the art RNHRD and Therapies Centre at the RUH in June 2019.

The RUH Mendip Members Constituency meeting, at the Mendip District Council Chamber from 6-8pm, is being hosted by RUH Trust Public Governors for Mendip Anne Martin & Mike Welton.

Anne Martin said: "People in the Mendip area are very interested in health provision now and in the future, and this is a great opportunity to hear first-hand about matters that affect us all."

Mike Welton said: "This is an important meeting because this is a three-way partnership between the RUH Trust, the Somerset STP and the people of Mendip, who we know want to hear about and to be involved in the future of their local health care."
