



Do You Perform Point of Care Testing?



If you perform any of the above tests - yes you do!

But are you aware of your responsibilities...?

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Point of Care Testing (PoCT):

The generation of any result in a clinical setting by non-laboratory staff.

- Only staff that have received formal training and had their competency assessed may use a PoCT device
- Follow standard operating procedures to generate the result and remember to follow the health and safety policy
- Ensure the device is working correctly and had all relevant maintenance carried out
- Run quality control samples before patient use
- Results should be reviewed immediately with reference to clinical history.
 Results produced are your responsibility. Do not share password/barcodes
- Results that do not fit the clinical history should be repeated or a sample sent to the laboratory
- Record each and every result you generate, use templates where possible.
 It is Trust policy to include:
 - Result
 - Date &Time
 - Device used (inc. location)
 - Strip/Cartridge number where appropriate
 - Operator ID
- Report any equipment faults to your ward manager/link trainer or via Datix under the PoCT section
