




















How to get to hospital:



<mark>Ask a friend or carer</mark> to bring you to hospital




There is a car park – <mark>remember to bring</mark> some money<mark>.</mark>



There is a <mark>map</mark> on the back of this leaflet to show you the car parks and the hospital.









If you are having an operation the doctor will ask you to sign a consent form.

 Make sure you know what is going to happen.

2. Ask questions.

3. If you understand and agree, sign the form.

Remember that no-one else can sign the consent form if you are over 18 years old.

If you find it hard to say yes or no or do not understand difficult information a <mark>best interest</mark> form called a DOH Form 4 should be used.







Ask them to bring you some clothes.




Make sure you know which medicines to take.



Leaving hospital:

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
Make sure you know the time and date of your follow-up appointment.




Take all your things home with you.




Make sure there is someone at home to look after you.
