Following Diagnosis of Oesophagus or stomach cancer

This leaflet explains what diagnostic tests and treatments you may require following diagnosis of oesophagus or stomach cancer. It explains who will be looking after you and who you can contact for advice or additional support should you need it.





Your main contacts

Your keyworker is your main point of contact from diagnosis and thereafter. Even if your treatment is carried out in Bristol your keyworker can still be contacted if needed for advice or support.

Diagnostic Tests

It may be necessary for you to have one or more of the following investigations to enable your surgeon to make a diagnosis

- Gastroscopy at the RUH
- CT at the RUH
- Endoscopic Ultrasound at the Bristol Royal Infirmary
- PET scan at Cheltenham
- Laparoscopy at the RUH.

Please see accompanying oesophagus/stomach booklet for further details on these tests.

All of these tests may be needed before a treatment plan can be recommended. This can be frustrating for you and your family but they are crucial in order to determine the most effective treatment for you.

Treatments

Following all investigations a treatment plan will be recommended following a team meeting which is held at the BRI on a Friday morning. The team is made up of specialists in oesophagogastric work; surgeons, radiologists, pathologists, oncologists and specialist nurses.

Chemotherapy

This may be given prior to surgery, used on its own or as part of a trial and is usually given at the RUH as an outpatient unless you are told otherwise.

Surgery

Preoperative assessment and surgery is carried out at the BRI but all other approintments can usually be at the RUH. Follow-up post surgery can always be done at the RUH.

Chemoradiation

This treatment can sometimes be recommended as an alternative to surgery, and involves both chemotherapy and radiotherapy treatment, which is carried out by Dr Falk at the BRI. This treatment cannot be carried out at the RUH.

Radiotherapy

This treatment can sometimes be given at the RUH.

Stent

This procedure is carried out at the RUH and can be arranged by the keyworker as appropriate if other treatments are not recommended.

Consultation

Following all appropriate investigations you will have the opportunity to discuss treatment options in clinic and a plan will be put in place. You will also receive a copy of the clinic letter which is sent to your GP, to confirm plans.
