Volunteer at the RUH this summer and you could find yourself digging up the flowerbeds.

Rather like the magical private gardens hidden in London squares, the RUH is lucky enough to have a series of courtyard gardens running along the central corridor bringing light and pleasure to anyone walking past.

Friends of the RUH volunteers can spend a few hours a week tidying or embark on more adventurous projects to redesign whole areas. Together with a well established and pioneering arts project, you may find yourself potting out the bedding plants under a 10 foot high crane fly sculpture or weeding next to a wire March hare.

Bernard and Jane Rymer have been volunteering in the RUH gardens for the past two years and make up part of the 8-strong team. Jane says "I love being outside and after 40 years of working in an office, volunteering in the gardens seemed a perfect idea. Hopefully my time spent volunteering helps make a difference to the environment for patients, staff and visitors."
