## Our priorities for winter

- 1. Keep patients as safe as possible in the hospital
- 2. Ensure ambulance offloads for patient safety and to ensure ambulances can get to emergency calls
- 3. Look after our staff



# Key actions

**RUH** committed to fund winter projects up to £2m in September – earlier than historically

- Emergency Department staff increase cover in evenings and in ambulance cohort area
- Expand Same Day Emergency Care during winter
   into evenings
- Expand weekend medical and therapy cover on wards to support flow
- Ward works complete by December to enable capacity increase from January

**System** also received £9m to fund more community capacity over winter.

- Ward 4 at St Martin's opened with 23 beds
- South Newton to open with 40-50 beds
- United Care BANES to provide 1,000 hours of domiciliary care per week


What % of the year does RUH historically cancel hip and knee replacements?

### This winter - bed model



Core bed gap of about 100 – historically delivered through delayed ambulances, cancellation of surgery and escalation beds

Ward 4 at St Martin's has been major help


South Newton and ward works both delayed and posing risk for winter.

## **Winter 2023!**

New Hospital Programme modelled a 95 bed shortfall currently with growth of 244 over 10 years

#### RUH needs to:

- Create winter surge ward
- Progress FBC for ward component of NHP



## Conclusion

- 1. RUH prepared earlier in year mobilising schemes
- 2. Staffing is a key risk to increasing capacity ahead of time
- 3. Need to think about RUH plans for future years as well as winter response winter ward
- 4. Our priority is safety and staff welfare
