It can be a useful tool to think about the things you might or might not want to happen, if you should lose capacity or be too unwell to express what matters most yourself.

It can also help you think about what information you might need from those who may be caring for you, and a chance to start discussions with healthcare teams involved in your care and treatment. We hope this tool will lead you, step by step, to think about and share the things that matter most to you.

Your wishes and preferences can change over time and these can be updated and shared at any time.
