

# Having your vision checked







The nurse will tell you what they are going to do.



The nurse will then check your eyes using a special machine.

You need to rest your head and look straight.

You need to keep your head still.



The nurse may put some eye drops in your eyes if needed.



Your carer or friend can stay with you if you want.



You may need to sit in the waiting room until doctor calls out your name.



Doctor will take you to the treatment room.



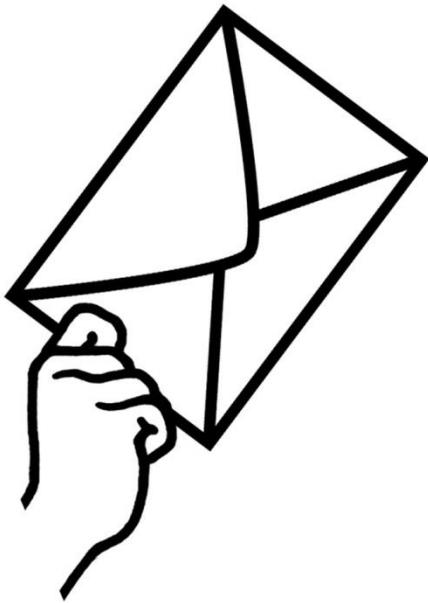
Doctor will look at your eyes.
