


Help and support for carers



Involving you in your loved one's stay in hospital

We appreciate that families, friends and neighbours have an important role in meeting the care needs of many of our patients. We want to make sure that, if you look after someone, you are involved during their stay in hospital, and in planning for their discharge.

If you are visiting them in hospital, please let one of the nursing staff know that you are a carer, and we will do all we can to support you and the person you care for

Are you a Carer?

'A carer is anyone who cares, unpaid, for a family member or friend who could not always manage without their support. They might look after someone with a physical disability, long-term health condition, mental health issue or a problem with substance misuse' (Carer Support Wiltshire) A carer can be an adult, young person or child who may not consider themselves as a carer.

We support carers to have open access to visiting, and to stay with patients who have enhanced needs and require extra support. Please speak to the nurse in charge.
