About the Paediatric Epilepsy Service



My name is Faye Price and I work closely with Dr Eve Bassett and Dr Toby Hunt, together we run the Paediatric Epilepsy Service at the Royal United Hospital Bath NHS Trust.

The Epilepsy Service can provide ongoing care to children and young people with epilepsy by offering specialist information, support, education and guidance right through from diagnosis to transition to adult services.

I am here to support children and families on the following:

- Telephone and email support between appointments.
- To help you understand the epilepsy diagnosis and how to manage seizures.
- To give advice about medication and possible side effects.
- To give emergency medication training for parents/carers.
- Provide health care plans for school as required.
- Support family if admitted to the Children's Ward at the RUH.
- To give clear guidance when modifying treatment or weaning off medication.
- To provide written or links to online information about epilepsy, treatment options and lifestyle issues.
- Jointly run transition clinics with the adult epilepsy nurse.

How to contact the Epilepsy Nurse

I work 4 days per week, usually a Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday. I may not be available to answer your call straight away but please leave a message and your call will be returned as soon as possible. Alternatively you can send an email.
