# Endoscopic Retrograde Cholangiopancreatography (ERCP)

## After your investigation

BECAUSE YOU HAVE BEEN SEDATED, FOR THE NEXT 24 HOURS...

- You cannot **legally** drive
- You must not operate machinery
- You must not drink alcohol
- You should not sign legally binding agreements
- You must not care for dependants, children or elderly relatives
- You must have someone to supervise you at home

## You may experience:

- Slight abdominal discomfort immediately following the procedure. This can be alleviated by hot drinks and moving around.
- A mildly sore throat which usually resolves within 24 hours; taking throat lozenges will help.

## Follow up

- You may resume normal medications after your ERCP. Please ask if you are not sure. If you have been advised to stop your warfarin for this test, a nurse will let you know before you leave when it is safe to resume taking it.

- If biopsies have been taken the results will be made known to you at your outpatient appointment or at your GP's surgery.
- It is advisable that you avoid large rich meals for the day following your ERCP.
- You should remain nil by mouth for 4 hours post procedure. Following the 4 hours nil by mouth, fluids can then be resumed for 6 hours starting with water.

## **IF YOU DEVELOP ANY OF THE FOLLOWING SYMPTOMS:**

- Severe pain and/or vomiting
- Passing or vomiting blood
- A raised temperature and/or 'flu like' symptoms
- Redness, pain and/or swelling of the injection site
