It is important to read your admission letter which will give you the right information.

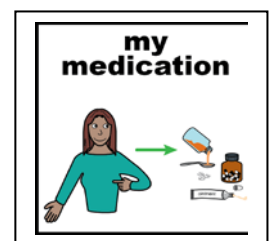


### **How can I prepare myself?**

- If you are having an operation please remember to remove any nail polish and jewellery.
- Please ensure you have some pain relief at home before your child is discharged, as we do not routinely provide this.
- If your child has additional needs please contact the ward in advance so we can discuss your needs.
- If you have any dietary requirements please ensure you inform the nurse on arrival and bring any specialist diet with you.

### **What to bring?**

- Please remember to bring all your medication and inhalers into hospital and let your nurse know you have it with you.
- Dressing gown, slippers and pyjamas
- Toiletries
- Special feeds or baby milk, nappies and baby wipes
- Comfort toys
- Communication aids
- Please only bring essentials- the hospital cannot accept any responsibility for any loss or damage to personal items



This is for day patients and over night stays

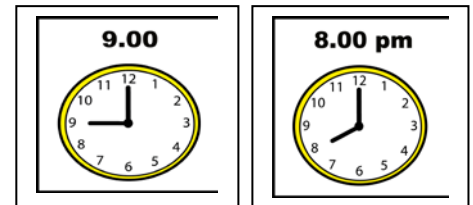
## Will I be staying overnight?

- In some cases you may need to stay over night
- If you stay overnight one parent can stay with you.  
At each bed space there is a chair bed for one parent to stay.



## Visiting times

- 9.00-20.00 Monday to Sunday
- Please be mindful of the amount of visitors around the bed, if there are visiting siblings they need to be with an adult at all times.



## Going Home

- Please ensure you have some pain relief at home before your child is discharged, as we do not routinely provide this.
- There may be some restrictions after the procedure these will be explained by your doctor or nurse.
